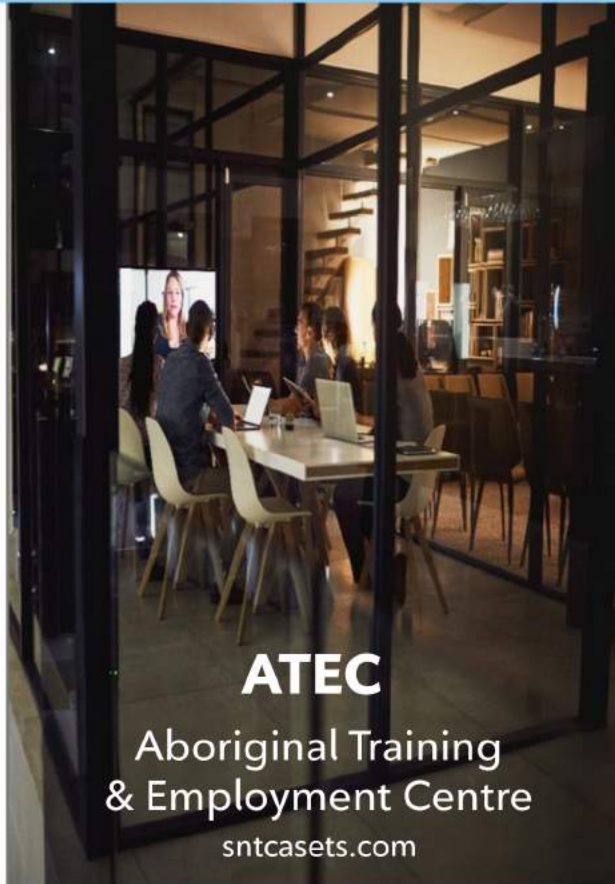

BLANKET CEREMONY: HONOURING YOUTH

On the afternoon of July 27, 2022, eight Splatsin youth were honored in a blanket ceremony by Cultural Supports Laureen Felix, Edna Felix, Wayne Christian, and Splatsin Stsmamlt Services staff. Personalized Star blankets, hand drums, traditional Secwepemc Songs CDs, hand drum bags, sage, and sweet grass braids were given to each of the youth.

The ceremony started with each youth entering the Splatsin Community Centre in a grand entry style while being followed by two people that they chose as their supports to do the honor of blanketing them. The cultural support team led them in the grand entry with an honor song, brushing each youth off with eagle fans, followed by a beautiful bear dance and cleansing with sage.



The ceremony was a mix of formal and indigenous culture with the medicine wheel colors white, red, yellow, and black being the event theme. Each youth were given the opportunity to invite 10 family and friends of their choice. Entertainment was provided during the catered dinner with hoop dancer Kristyn Schoenknecht, a traditional story told by Trina Antoine, and a PowerPoint slide show with pictures and write-ups highlighting each youth's accomplishments and future goals.

Six of the eight youth were able to participate in the ceremony. Due to unforeseen circumstances, the other two individuals were not in attendance. The two absent youth were hand-delivered their gifts at a later date.

The ceremony left an imprint of pride and joy throughout the afternoon. Tears of happiness were especially heavy as one of the youth had been welcomed home and presented a beaded medallion as a gift from Laureen Felix after a powerful honor song while everyone gathered around her and welcomed her home.

Returning to the Shuswap River, the largest of the large, the strongest of the strong: this is the year for the big salmon run – lets pray for their safe return!

Salmon possess many virtues Indigenous prize most among themselves; courage, persistence against great odds, beauty, grace, strength, agility, and a lonely determination to fulfill the purpose of their lives – to return to their native rivers, to spawn and complete their duty to their race.

Even in death, the salmon achieve a classic sacrifice that resonates in the human soul, yielding its flesh to provide sustenance for its own offspring and all other life in the rivers.

Splatsin Title & Rights is collaborating with other departments to organize some time for salmon harvesting and preserving of foods on the Shuswap River. We invite the people of Splatsin to participate and enjoy the good company of friends and family while being on the land doing what we do best – practicing survival by providing sustenance for our people.
