## SALMON RIVER WATERSHED INITIATIVE CONTINUES

*This important initiative is focused on identifying, securing, and restoring fish habitat and water flows in the Salmon River Watershed.*

This past year, 80 km of the Salmon River were successfully mapped and important fish habitats as well as impacted sites were identified for conservation and restoration opportunities. Yucwmenlúcwu is being supported by Ecoscape Environmental Consultants Ltd. who are currently developing an Aquatic Habitat Index (AHI), which will help us to utilize cultural information and incorporate site-specific cultural values to prioritize sites that are identified for restoration along the Salmon River.

There will be several opportunities for Splatsin membership to participate in this initiative over the next two years.



The first of which is an Open House and Field Tour scheduled for Friday, November 18, 2022. We hope you will consider attending. Refreshments, lunch, bussing, and prizes will be provided. More information is included in this newsletter. Yucwmenlúcwu also invites community members to participate in an Implementation Team and contribute in a technical advisory support role. Details of the initiative will be presented and available to all attending the Open House and Field Tour. An important goal of the Initiative is to integrate cultural knowledge and values into decision making for longer-term benefits and values related to the Salmon River Watershed.

Other Secwepemc communities, which have interests in the Salmon River Watershed, have also been invited to participate, including Adams Lake, Neskonlith, and Little Shuswap te Secwepemc. It is important that we honour and protect Sáwllkwa, and uphold Indigenous knowledge and teachings related to the Salmon River.
