MONUMENT PLANNING UPDATE

The Monument Planning Group began meeting in May 2022 with the goal of creating a site to commemorate those Splatsin members who attended Residential Schools. The site will include a monument and surrounding grounds. The Group is comprised of Splatsin Survivors, community volunteers and supporters. Survivors and family members have participated in these meetings. For those Survivors who were unable to attend the September 2022 gathering, you can still submit your ideas to us at the contact below.

We are pleased to announce that we have received initial funding for the project from Indigenous Services Canada. This funding has allowed us to seek submissions for a lead artist to design and construct the monument. We envision a largescale sculptural monument, surrounding area with vegetation, seating and landscape features. The call for submissions has been distributed nationwide.

We intend to also engage the community and community artists to contribute to the project. We are working on plan for this part of the project and welcome ideas. Local artist, Janet Cardiff has assisted our group in developing the submission process and selection guidelines.

Our group is also exploring possible intergenerational workshops to explore how the trauma of Residential Schools has impacted the Survivors and their children and grandchildren. More information to come once we have confirmed the session.

The Committee meets twice monthly, usually every second Monday at 1:00 p.m. Survivors and their family members are encouraged to attend. Our next meeting is March 14 at 1:00 p.m. in the Elders Room at Tsm7aksaltm. Survivors and family members are encouraged to attend.

A group led by Survivors has been meeting to plan the monument to commemorate those Splatsin members that attended Residential Schools.

So far, 146 members have been identified; 46 of that number are still living today. The project will be located at Splatsin, in the southern interior of British Columbia.
