
JUNIOR YOUTH RECREATION PROGRAM

ST. MARY'S CHURCH PROGRESS UPDATE

Preliminary renovation work is underway at St. Mary's Church and good progress is being made. Please note that this preliminary work is required prior to completing a final overall design.

Two Splatsin Band Members are on the ground completing this job, including one individual that is interested in pursuing a career as a Red Seal carpenter. The Project Manager is also a Splatsin Band Member who possesses significant construction experience.



The church will be insulated with modern materials that are safe for the public and environmentally friendly. Magnesium oxide (M2O) boards are being considered, which will provide an older look of the original church but possess a much higher resistance to conductive heat flow (R-value).

The Second Public Consultation for the church was successfully held on Friday, April 14, and the summary report for this meeting will be provided to the Splatsin Community for review and to confirm project deliverables.

kekésu7 (spring salmon)	63	Caught by Splatsin Anglers including the gill

Sockeye return in 4-year cycles — i.e., it will take 4 years for spawned Sockeye eggs to return to the river as spawning adults. Last year we saw a dominant-cycle year sqlelten7úŵi (Sockeye) run arrive in lower numbers than expected. 2023 is a non-dominant year and the first year of fish returning from 2019 which was heavily impacted by landslides and heat waves. Less brood fish were able to spawn in 2019 and the ocean conditions have been variable, so we can expect a relatively low return of fish in 2023.

Table 2: Preliminary Outlook for Salmon Fishing in 2023

Salmon Run	Relative Abundance	Notes on run abundance
Early Shuswap sqlelten7úẁi (Sockeye)	Low abundance	This is a small run and is predicted to have better returns than average
Late Shuswap sqlelten7úẁi (Sockeye)	Very Low abundance	The brood year in 2019 had historically low successful spawning. The return should improve this year but will be in low numbers.
Spring kekésu7 (Chinook) Bessette, Duteau, Creighton, Harris Creeks	Low abundance	There are very few fish in this run, and a low abundance is expected to continue in 2023.
Summer kekésu7 (Chinook) Eagle and Salmon River	Low abundance	This is an endangered run and low abundance is expected in 2023.
Summer kekésu7 (Chinook) Lower and Middle Shuswap	High abundance	These Chinook are considered not as risk and are expected to return in healthy numbers.
Sxeyqs (Coho)	Low, but improving	Survival thresholds of 3% were met in 2021, but not in 2022. Secwepemc has advocated for reduced fishing in Canada for conservation


