Shihiya Language Program – John Jones

Waytkp (Hello everyone):

I would like to acknowledge our fluent speaker Donna Antoine and all her expertise she dedicates to our program. Kukwstsámc Donna.

Many years ago, I heard one of the elders say that our language came from the land. It took a long time to realize what they meant. Last year when we did the story, Coyote Juggles his Eyes, it became clear. When Coyote he lost his eyes and was using kinnikinnic berries for eyes and could not see very well. As he came down the mountain he ran into several trees. Each time they would have a conversation with the trees. Near the bottom of the mountain, he ran into a tree. The tree said, "Mulc, re ra amétentsut." ("I call myself the Cotton wood tree.") The land had a language before the Secwápmc were put on this land. Only after I heard this story did it make sense the language came from the land.

At Shihiya we are using traditional creation stories to learn the language. We continue to create vocabulary lists and use the words to make set questions and responses. We are working towards proficiency in pronunciation, some words are easy to pronounce, some are exceedingly difficult. We are using Book Creator which has an audio clip to assist in teaching, our fluent speaker can be heard as many times as the reader wishes.

It's great to hear Shihiya students come up to me and share their Secwapmctsin with me!







Graham Tea Biscuits

Oven: 220c or 425F

<u>Tripled Recipe</u>. It was a hit with the Kids.4 ½ cups flour3 cups graham cracker

crumbs

1 ½ tsp salt 6 tbsp sugar

1/3 c. baking powder, 1 ½ cup margarine or

butter

2 ¼ cups milk (depending on texture)

Directions:

Combine margarine, flour, graham cracker crumbs, salt, sugar and baking powder well, add milk slowly and gently knead into a ball. The dough should have a soft fluffy texture.
Roll out flat with a rolling pin. Using a glass, cup or cookie cutter, cut into portions 2 cm approx. ¾ inch thick. Place on a parchment covered cookie sheet.

Bake at 425F or 220C for 10 to 12 minutes.
