Hi everyone!

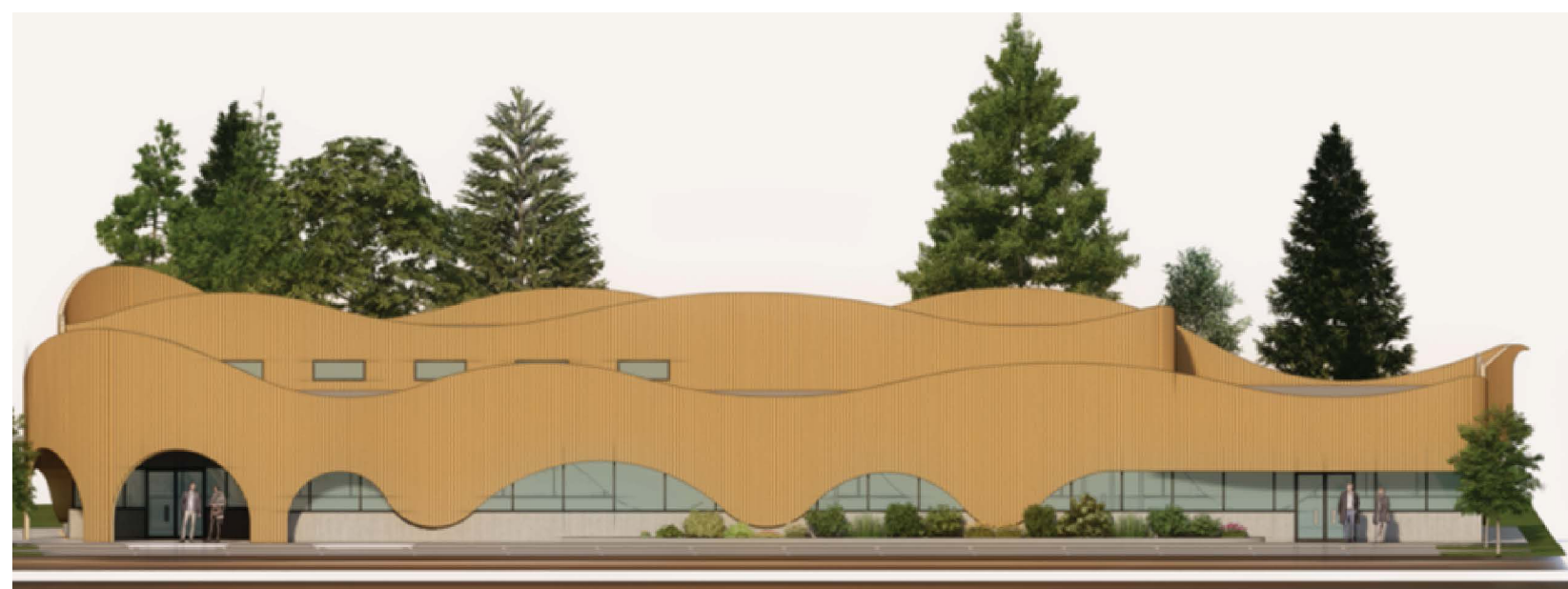
My name is Tylar, and I am Nlaka’pamux, from the Lower Nicola Indian Band (near Merritt B.C.), where I grew up.
