### JUNIOR YOUTH RECREATION PROGRAM



# Splatsin Fisheries UPDATES AND REFLECTION

# TRAINING -COMPLETED

Yucwmenlucwu Technicians recently completed training for limnology trawls. These trawl will take place on Arrow Lakes Reservoir in August and see to collect data on fish species density and diversity.

Yuc staff took part in online Forests and Range Ecosystems Practices (FREP) training which will allow the team to undertake habitat assessments in the Splatsin Area of Caretaker Responsibility in summer 2025. We are looking forward to on-the-ground training soon.

# TRAINING -COMPLETED

Canadian Aquatic Biomonitoring Network (CABIN) training was completed in late June. CABIN training will allow Yuc staff to manage, collect, and analyze data on benthic invertebrates- the main food source for juvenile salmon and an indicator of river health.

Swiftwater Rescue Technician training was a challenging 3-day course that teaches staff to safely take on projects in-and-around fast water.
