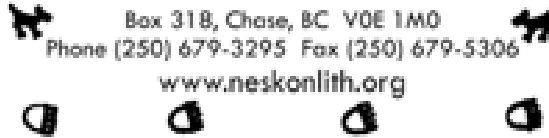

Health Care Assistant Program – Neskonlith Indian Band & Okanagan College

Status: Part-time (20 hrs per week) , September 2024 – June 2025

Salary Range: \$25.00 – \$35.00 per hour depending on experience.

Summary of Position:

To provide support to the Lakes Bands students participating in the Health Care Assistant Program at Okanagan College in Salmon Arm. Support and mentor the Health Care Assist program (HCAP) students training Health Care field in Indigenous cultural ways of being, knowing, and doing. The position will also involve supporting students and health care supervisory staff in cultural sensitivity training. The position will involve some travel between Chase, B.C and Salmon Arm B.C.

Responsibilities:

Key Tasks

- a) Be prepared to drive the HCAP vehicle every weekday morning on a 60 to 75 minute trip.
- b) Ensure the vehicle is in safe driving condition.
- c) Ensure the vehicle is properly fueled, serviced, clean, and ready for travel.

- Able to demonstrate empathy for colleagues and clients.
- Able to explain and demonstrate good time management, a learned skill.
- Able to demonstrate and mentor good self-care and management of self – being balanced.
