Wildland Firefighter Training Program

Program Outline

Program Scope: Training community members to the Type 2 Wildland Firefighter standard as designated by BC Wildfire Service. Training will be provided by a verified contractor in community and all trainer fees will be covered by FNESS directly.

Program Value: Total courseload valued in excess of \$20,000 for industry equivalent training.

Program Timelines: 2023 Spring onward (geography and weather permitting)

Eligibility: All First Nation communities are eligible to apply. Maximum occupancy of 20 participants. Minimum of 10 preferred.

Eligible Costs and Activities: All contractor fees associated with training courses listed on Page 2. Course descriptions can be found in <u>Appendix A</u>

Facility Requirements: Community must provide a classroom setting, an outdoor area to practice fireline fundamentals and if applicable, an area with adequate wood to practice chainsaw use.

Payments: FNESS will cover all costs associated with the instructor as per contract between FNESS and the instructor.

Process

Step 1: Fill out the Application Form and submit to Karen Alexandre kalexandre@fness.bc.ca

FNESS wildfire specialists will review the application and will enter a contract agreement with the instructor that is preferred by the community. If the community does not have an instructor in mind, FNESS will connect the community contact with one of our vetted and contracted instructors.

Step 2: Coordinate facilities and dates with instructor and relay to FNESS.

The instructor will then forward the dates and course schedule to FNESS Wildfire Specialists for approval. If the community does not have adequate facilities to host the instructor, please contact a FNESS wildfire specialist to discuss alternate venues.

Step 3: Contractor will provide a copy of course attendance, feedback, and scanned certificates back to FNESS.

As part of the funding process, FNESS is required to track who in each community has received wildland fire training.
