## **SCOPE OF WORK**

# **1.** Research, Develop and Produce a Community Plan Related to the Four Pillars for ALIB.

Lead, coordinate and facilitate engagement with ALIB Leadership, Chief and Council, and Community Members (Urban and on Reserve) to complete a needs analysis and develop and produce a Community Plan and budget related to the four pillars that spans the duration of the funding.

## 2. Research and Reporting

- Conduct community-based research to identify needs, capacity development opportunities, and service gaps;
- Develop a comprehensive plan to meet and address those gaps and opportunities;
- Prepare and deliver monthly updates to CEO, leadership, community members, and others as required; and
- Complete project reports as per the Agreement on behalf of ALIB

- Ensure all engagements adhere to established safety guidelines.
- Consult with all stakeholders associated with the funding criteria.
