The Splatsin are the most southern tribe of the Secwepemc Nation, the largest Interior Salish speaking First Nation in Canada, whose aboriginal territory stretches from the BC/Alberta border near the Yellowhead Pass to the plateau west of the Fraser River, southeast to the Arrow Lakes and to the upper reaches of the Columbia River.

THE OPPORTUNITY

The Social Development Assistant will support the implementation and coordination of social development programs aimed at enhancing the well-being of Indigenous communities. This role involves assisting with community engagement, program delivery, and administrative tasks, ensuring that initiatives align with the cultural values, traditions, and priorities of the organization.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Assist in the planning, coordination, and delivery of social development programs, workshops, and events.
- Ensure programs address community needs, including housing, health, education, and cultural preservation.
- Collaborate with other stakeholders to develop culturally appropriate materials and resources.
- Act as a liaison between the organization and community members to foster trust and participation.
- Conduct outreach to engage community members, including elders, youth, and families.
- Support consultations and meetings, ensuring community voices are heard and incorporated into programs.
- Maintain accurate records of program activities, participant attendance, and progress reports.
- Assist in preparing reports, proposals, and presentations as needed.
- Manage logistics for events and workshops, including scheduling, booking venues, and coordinating supplies.
- Uphold and promote the organization's values, ensuring all activities respect Indigenous traditions, languages and cultural protocols.
- Support relationships with external stakeholders, including government agencies, NGOs, and community partners.
- Provide information and updates on programs and activities to stakeholders as required.

• Assist with other tasks to support the organization's social development goals.

EDUCATION AND TRAINING

- Diploma or degree in social work, community development, or a related field, or an equivalent amount of work experience in one or more of these fields.
- Experience working with Indigenous communities or organizations is highly desirable.
- Strong interpersonal and communication skills, with the ability to work effectively in diverse settings.
